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Dear Exporter

The attached certificate has been issued under the *Export Control Act 2020* and will remain in force until the date specified on the certificate unless the holder of the Export Licence requests cancellation or contravenes the requirements of the Act.

It should be noted that the holder of the Export Licence is responsible for notifying the department within 7 days if any of the following notifiable events occur:

General:

- ♦ the licence holder ceases to carry on the meat export business to which the licence relates;
- ♦ the licence holder, or a person in management or control of the business, is convicted of an offence against the law of the Commonwealth, a State or Territory;
- ♦ a person who has been described to the Secretary, in the application for the licence, as a person in management and control of the business ceases to be a person in management and control of the business;
- ♦ a person who has not been described to the Secretary, in the application for the licence, as a person in management and control of the business begins to be a person in management and control of the business;
- ♦ the licence holder received notice that the licence holder is no longer regarded as an approved supplier of meat by a foreign government importing authority, instrumentality or organisation;
- ♦ a change of licence holder's name;
- ♦ a change in the scope or status of the licence holder's AUS-MEAT Accreditation;

and/or

If the licence holder is a corporation:

- ♦ a court orders that the corporation be wound up;
- ♦ a resolution is passed that the corporation be wound up voluntarily;

and/or

If the licence holder is an individual;

- ♦ he or she becomes bankrupt;
- ♦ he or she executes a deed or arrangement, or a deed of assignment under part X of the *Bankruptcy Act 1966*;

and/or

If the licence holder is a partnership that operates the meat export business;

- ♦ circumstances are also prescribed:
- ♦ the membership or partnership is changed;
- ♦ or the partnership is dissolved.



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Please note: under section 205(1) of the Act, the Secretary may suspend an export licence if the holder of the licence ceases to be a fit and proper person, and/or a requirement referred to in subsection 191(2) of *the Act* and/or section 6-1 of the *Export Control (Meat and Meat Products) Rules 2021* is no longer met.
